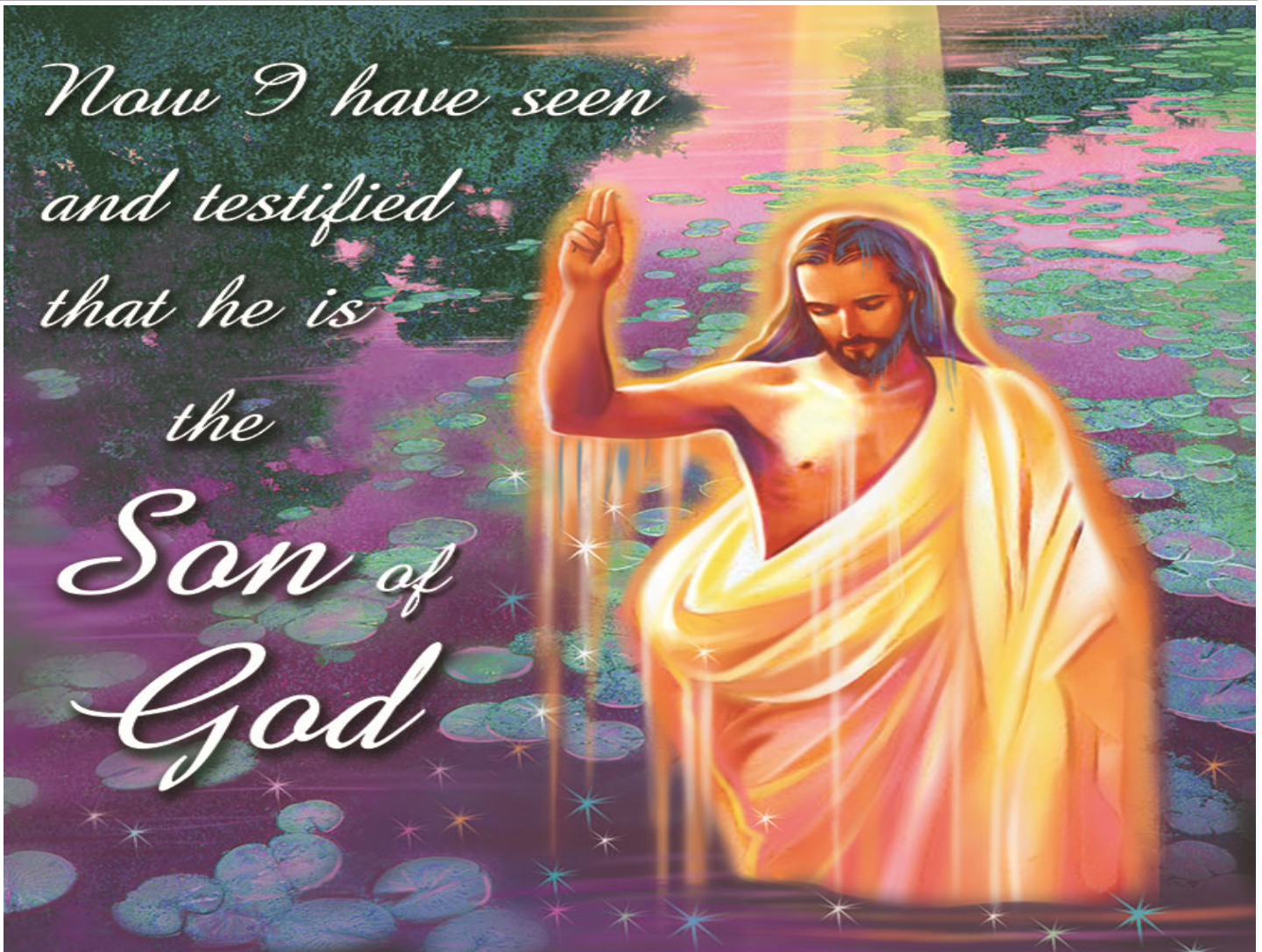

### A Reflection on the Readings

*“I saw the Spirit come down like a dove from heaven and remain upon him.” John 1:32*

When I read things like this, I always wonder what I would have seen if I were there. I wonder what a video camera would have seen. Was there an actual dove? A ray of sunlight suddenly breaking through clouds? A fresh breeze? How did John know it was real? When I was a teenager, there were ads for Memorex VHS tapes where sounds were played and were then followed by the question, “Is it live, or is it Memorex?” This question lurks when I have a moving spiritual experience. At rare times, I sink deeply into prayer and rest in the presence of God. Similarly, I can get stopped in my tracks by a sunset, a constellation or the sight of a mother stooping to straighten a child’s clothes as they enter church. Such a sight can take my breath away and fill my soul with a deep connection to God. And yet I ask, “Is it live, or is it Memorex?” and pray to have John’s confidence.
