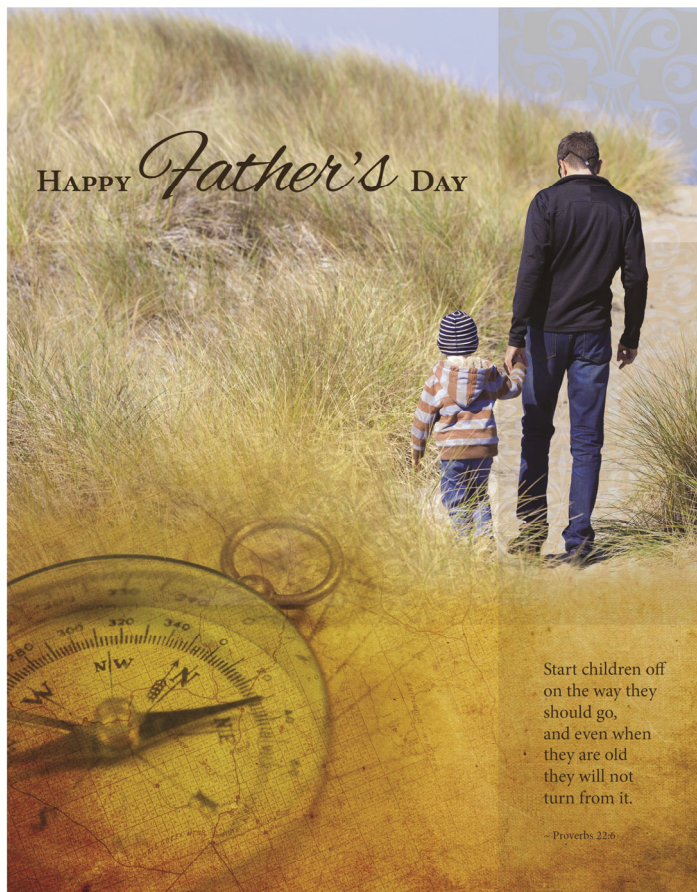

New Senior Meals Program

Madison County Catholic Charities of Alton is beginning this new program for the elderly with lower incomes in the Madison County area. The program provides seniors 60+ with a pre-boxed order of food. The box usually contains a canned meat, 4 canned vegetables, 2 canned fruits, a box of cereal, rice, evaporated milk, peanut butter, 2 juices and a block of cheese. St. Louis Food Bank will pre-box these items and bring them to their facility.

If you or someone you know needs this service, contact Madison County Catholic Charities at 618-462-0634, ext. 229 to sign up. The box will then need to be picked up by the person in need or someone on their behalf. There is an income guideline to qualify for the program.

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." John 6:51

Jesus was not trying to win friends and influence people with an attractive description of discipleship. In fact, he seems to be going overboard to repel his audience, using a term for eat that comes closer to gnaw like an animal. His message is not always easy to take in. But Jesus insists that he be ingested, taken into our lives so entirely that we become a part of him and he of us. After this discussion, many of Jesus' followers abandoned him.

We Catholics believe the consecrated bread and wine at Mass become, truly and entirely, the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Many who might otherwise be attracted to Catholicism regard this assertion as absurd, and they walk away. The Eucharist is not something easily understood or fully accepted, but received in faith, it is life-giving.

Lord, strengthen my belief in your presence in the Eucharist.
