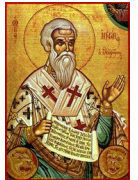

## St. Ignatius of Antioch

This disciple of the beloved Disciple John was consecrated Bishop around the year 69 by the Apostle Peter, the first Pope. A holy man who was deeply loved by the Christian faithful, he always made it his special care to defend right teaching and right practice among the early Christians. It was Bishop Ignatius who first used the term catholic to describe the whole Church. He wrote seven letters of encouragement, instruction and inspiration to the Christians in the communities he lived. We still have these letters as a great treasure of the Church today. These letters connect us to the early Church and the unbroken, clear teaching of the Apostles which was given to them directly by Jesus Christ. They also reveal the holiness of a man of God who became himself a living letter of Christ. The shedding his blood in the witness of holy martyrdom was the culmination of a life lived conformed to Jesus Christ. Ignatius sought to offer himself, in Christ, for the sake of the Church which he loved. His holy martyrdom occurred in the year 107.
